

Service Rifle Match July 2020

The Service Rifle Match consists of 50 rounds shot at 50m and 25m distances. There are various positions the shooter is required to adopt during the match. These consist of the prone, sitting, standing and resting off the Barricade positions.

The rifles used are generally, as issued during the First and Second World Wars, with open sights and calibers of that era. The most common calibers used are .303, .308 & 6.6 x 55.

Later modern rifles of the same calibers are not accepted. Bullet speed must not exceed 1100fps and all projectiles must be lead. No jacketed rounds permitted and no loading devices, such as stripper clips.

The Match is shot on the standard International 50 meter slow fire target.
